YOUR JOURNEY THROUGH CARE

Sometimes for reasons beyond your control you may have to be moved out of your family home and taken to live with a different family.

> In many situations you may still get to see your family and friends. Your social worker can talk to you about having 'family time' with your loved ones.

Your carer and social worker will help support your learning at your school and will support your education

> The people you will live with are called your foster carers. They are trained individuals employed by the fostering agency to look after you and support you in your journey through care

IMPORTANT TERMS



What is a Care Plan? This is a meeting where adults involved in your life meet to speak about what support is needed for you while you take your journey through care.

What is the meeting that happens at school?

This meeting is called a PEP (Personal Education Plan) and this is when you, your teacher and your social worker along with your carer meet up and speak about how you are doing at school.





What is a Child Review Meeting? This is a meeting which happens regularly where all the professionals that you see during your journey through care come along with you and your carer to talk about your journey and if there are any problems and how you can be supported

WHO IS ACORN FOSTERING?

Your foster carer works for an agency called Acorn Fostering. Along with your own social worker, another professional will visit your home and this will be your foster carers social worker, also known as a Supervising Social Worker.

WHY ARE THERE TWO SOCIAL WORKERS?



Your social worker will help and support you while you are on your journey through care. SUPERVISING SOCIAL WORKER

The Supervising Social Worker is there to support your carers to make sure they are looking after you
